Letter of Explanation Example: Work History Gap & Poor Work History due to PH

Dear Aspirus Hiring Team,

Please accept this letter of interest in the Certified Nursing Assistant position at Aspirus Tomahawk Hospital, a position I became aware of via Aspirus's website. I understand the recent gap in my work history may be a cause for concern, and this letter is meant to address the context of that gap as well as illustrate the steps I have taken to improve my situation and abilities.

In the summer of 2022, I was involved in a traumatic car accident which had a severe impact on my health and ability to perform my job duties. Because I was relatively new to my CNA position at that time, I was not eligible for short-term disability leave from my employer, and because I was hospitalized for two weeks following the accident, I missed a significant amount of work and was terminated. Although I gained another CNA position following the accident, I discovered lasting pain, mobility, and lifting issues which impacted my ability to perform those tasks. As a result, I was terminated from this position. After consulting with physicians, I decided to undergo surgery and extensive rehabilitation to manage these health problems with the goal of returning to caregiving, which is my passion area.

I completed a detailed and strict rehabilitation program focused on restoring my physical strength, improving my mobility, and using healthy methods to manage pain. During this time, I also worked privately with local families exploring hospice and assisted living options for family members. As part of that role, I created connections with multiple assisted living and skilled nursing facilities, learned about their services, and advocated for families new to the long-term care industry. In addition to the technical skills and compassionate approach I developed in previous CNA roles, I gained strong administrative skills, a greater knowledge of the long-term care industry, and familiarity with healthcare billing policies. After being medically approved to return to active caregiving, I am eager to use these skills in a new CNA opportunity with the long-term goal of becoming a Registered Nurse.

Despite the long gap in my work history and the two short-term positions preceding it, I have worked diligently to return to active caregiving and used my time to develop further relevant skills. I remain dedicated to my health as I continuously work to improve my mobility and strength so that I may continue caregiving for a long time. Thank you for considering my application and reviewing this letter, and I look forward to discussing my qualifications further in person.
